



Massachusetts Municipal Light Plant Solar Program **PMLD**



Program Details

The new Massachusetts Municipal Light Plant Solar Program allows residential customers of municipal light plants, such as the Princeton Municipal Light Department, to apply for a rebate for the purchase, installation, and usage of PV solar panels on their homes.

- The program includes a solar rebate of up to \$1.20/watt, capped at \$3,000 per system up to 5kw.
- Rebate applies to first 5 kw; maximum project size is 25kw.
- Eligible projects must have less than 20% shading, and face between 90 and 270 degrees.
- PMLD and DOER will each contribute \$.60/watt.



How to Apply

Interested customers must contact PMLD for pre-approval, then submit an application with the Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Company (MMWEC), PMLD's joint action agency. The form can be found online at www.mmwec.org. Customers may call 413-308-1400 to check application status.

The program runs through July 31, 2020 or until funds are exhausted.



Step One

Once the application is submitted and reviewed, MMWEC will forward it to the Massachusetts Department of Energy Resources (DOER).



Step Two

After the DOER evaluates the application, customers will be notified of their rebate status.



Step Three

Upon approval, customers have one year to schedule and complete installation of their solar panels. The rebate will be paid to the customer by MMWEC.
